It's Great Lake Race Time Again

First, a little history. ...

The Corinthian Sailing Association was formed to "promote the knowledge and expertise of its members and seamanship and sailing and to further promote and encourage the racing of sailboats as a sport in the Gulf South." It was a Corinthian member (and later commodore), Stanton Murray, who in 1989 began thinking about what types of races would bring even more people out to participate in racing on Lake Pontchartrain.

After much thought, and talks with other sailors, Stanton decided that the most popular races were the ones that started in one place and ended in another, <u>with a party</u>. On the lake were the LPRC, several New Orleans to Mandeville races, Mandeville to New Orleans races, a race around the lake, etc. The problem was that these were pretty serious races and the fastest boats usually started first.

How do you attract not-so serious racers along with the serious ones and get more people to the party? Stagger the start so the smaller boats would start first and more boats would finish at about the same time, and then they could all be together for the trophy presentation and party afterward. It

The staggered start also meant no hassle with corrected times. If you beat a boat across the line, you beat him.

To top it all off, power boaters would be invited to cruise over and enjoy the party. We might even find that sailors and power boaters can get along and have fun together. After all, we all love Lake Pontchartrain.

However, as Stanton says, "One great idea stays just a great idea unless it's implemented."

In January 1991, there was a new commodore, Ann Becnel. Stanton presented his concept and found Commodore Becnel to be just as enthusiastic as he was. Not only enthusiastic, but she had a name—The Great Lake Race. It seemed a natural since Ann grew up in Michigan near all those "other" Great Lakes and was now living on the greatest lake of all. Implementation had begun.

Stanton and Ann approached other yacht clubs. South Shore Yacht Club in New Orleans and St. Tammany Yacht Club in Slidell jumped on the bandwagon and joined Corinthians in planning the first race. It would start on the New Orleans lakefront and end in Slidell. The first race was September 14, 1991, with almost a hundred boats registered. Not bad for a first year race.

Every year the race has gotten a little larger with last year's participants setting a record with 129 monohull, multihull and power boats! The serious racers, the occasional racers and the power boaters have actually gotten together. Even the LPRC has added a class for the "recreational" nonspinnaker boats to go along with the racing non-spinnaker and spinnaker classes.

Class sizes are kept small so that more trophies have been given as more boats

participate. There are even special trophies for the first boats to finish with a first time skipper, with a three-bladed fixed prop, with an all female crew, and for multi-masted and liveaboard boats. Door prizes have also grown over the years and have included haul-outs, boat supplies, appraisals, bottom jobs, paint, dinners, etc.

And now for the 1994 Great Lake Race...


September 10th is the date and the 1994 Great Lake Race will be greater than ever. The general format has stayed the same, but some changes in the GLR have been made during the first three years. We believe the 1994 changes will please almost everyone.

There will be a FIRM time for the trophy presentation. The committee boat will pull up anchor at 6:30 p.m. and head for the party. Trophy presentations will begin promptly at 9:00 p.m.

There will be a boat parade down the New Orleans seawall for power boaters and sailors who would rather cruise than race. The boats will be decorated and trophies will be given. A special area will also be set up near the last turn of the race for parade boats who want to anchor and watch the racers turn for the finish.

As usual, no club affiliation is required to participate in the Great Lake Race. Everyone is welcome.
