

Minutes CSA General Membership Meeting December 4, 2019 New Orleans Y:acht Club

Board members attending: Mike Floberg, David Barr, Gerald Kuehler, Bill Phillips, Tim Fortney and Henry Barousse.

Call to Order: Commodore Floberg called the meeting to order at 7:12 p.m.

Reading of the previous minutes: the reading of the minutes was dispensed with by motion and vote Treasurer's Report: The current balance is \$7141. A rebate of \$700 is due for new course markers that mysteriously sank or disappeared.

Committee Reports:

Race Committee South Shore: By email to the board, Dieter reported that the last CSA SShore Double Handed Race was held on November 24. Two spin boats started but withdrew due to very light winds but three non-spin boats Luna, Paloma and Siren raced and finished in that order. Winds were 3-5 SE which made for long day on the race course. No boat completed the prerequisite number of races needed to qualify for boat of the year so no award to give out. I am working with Gerald to put the line drawings for Wednesday Night Series and Great Lake Race. The Lake Area Scheduling meeting is on December 9 and I have advised RC-elect Louise Bienvenue that I was not attending unless she asked me to help.

2019 BOAT OF THE YEAR RESULTS

Based on meeting our criteria of racing in at least 10 of the 19 races (includes the RTL & GLR) here is what I got, based on the boat's best 10 finishes:

<u>Spinnaker</u>: Only <u>Whiskers</u> had at least 10 races (13). (<u>The Bear</u> only had 9 races.) Also, if I combined David Barr's two boats <u>Good Stuff II</u> and <u>Cool J</u> they had a combined 10 races and would have gotten 2^{nd} .

Non-spin "A": <u>Floridays</u> won with 13 races, followed by <u>Knot Normal Too</u> (14 races) and then <u>Afternoon Delight</u> (12 races).

Non-Spin "B": Sea Fever won (12 races) and Summer Wind was 2nd (11 races).

It's encouraging that we had 7 boats with at least 10 races. A total of 23 boats participated in the 19 races at one time or another.

2019 TURKEY DAY RACE

We had a good turnout, with eleven boats signing in at the skippers' meeting. With the wind on the east side of south, we chose a course from M1 to J to L1 and back. The race started on a beat with light but sufficient wind from the south by southeast, but dropped to nothing as most of the fleet was still trying to make it to J. Eventually, the wind filled back in on the west side of south, and held. Following is the order of finish as I was able to piece it together.


