

He personally recruited members to establish a North Shore fleet, introducing many of us to racing for the first time, as well as coaching, teaching, and mentoring us, while expanding the base of the Corinthian Sailing Association. Charley sailed his last race on March 30. He passed away 11 days later on April 10, nine days short of his 89th birthday.

2019 South Shore Race Results

CSA Triangle race was on June 1st. The boats started at A mark with a beat to Delta. The staggered start was for 7: 11 through 7:19 for most the boats. Wind was 9 to 12 mph out of the NE. This was a great leg upwind. At Delta the wind died and shifted to south. The last 300 feet of beat was light and wavy, power up sailed was critical with 110 taking angle. Most boats rounding at 8pm. It took 1 hour for everyone to get back due to light winds and shifts. Spinnakers were up for maybe 10 minutes and then the shift. Everyone had to tack to C mark. Pinocchio went the most south and still missed C mark by 260 feet. From C to A, the winds were light and building with finishing at hull speed.


